## PARENT/ GUARDIAN CODE OF CONDUCT

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You must ensure the standards of the Fair Play Code are applied by demonstrating the five core values that will lead to fair play for all:

- Integrity
- Respect
- Responsibility
- Fairness
- Safety

In addition to Netball Victoria's and Stonnington City Netball Association's (SCNA) General Code of Conduct, as a parent/ guardian in any activity held by or under the auspices of Netball Victoria, Region, an Affiliated Association/League or Club you must meet the following requirements in regard to your conduct during any such activity or event.

- 1. Fully comply with the Child Safety in Netball Code of Conduct.
- 2. If your child is interested, encourage them to participate in the appropriate netball activity. However, if your child is not willing to participate, do not force him or her.
- 3. Remember, children are involved in organised activity for their enjoyment, not yours.
- 4. Focus upon your child's effort and performance rather than the overall outcome of the event. This assists your child in setting realistic goals related to his/her ability by reducing the emphasis on winning.
- 5. Teach your child that an honest effort is as important as victory, so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- 6. Encourage your child to always play according to the rules and abide by the SCNA Codes of Conduct and By-Laws.
- 7. Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a game.
- 8. Remember that children learn best from example. Applaud good play by all players.
- 9. If you disagree with an umpire or coach raise the issue through the appropriate channels rather than question their judgement and honesty in public.
- 10. Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse.
- 11. Recognise and respect the value and importance of administrators, coaches, umpires and officials. They provide recreational activities for all players and deserve your support.
- 12. Be a model of good sporting behaviour for children to observe and copy.
- 13. Be courteous in communication with administrators, coaches, players and umpires. Teach children to do likewise.
- 14. Support the use of age appropriate development activities and modified rules.
- 15. Supervise your children (or children under your care) both on and off the court at all times.
